Additional Federal Actions Needed for Infrastructure Projects Objectives were to examine:

- the extent to which selected federal agencies have policies for consulting with Indian tribes and ANCs on infrastructure projects and related activities;
- (2) key factors tribes and selected federal agencies identified that hinder effective consultation on infrastructure projects;
- (3) steps selected federal agencies have taken to facilitate tribal consultation.

URANIUM CONTAMINATION

Overall Scope, Time Frame, and Cost Information Is Needed for Contamination Cleanup on the Navajo Reservation Objectives were to examine:

- the extent to which the agencies achieved the targets set in the 5-year plan and reasons why or why not;
- (2) what is known about the future scope of work, time frames, and costs; and
- (3) any key challenges faced by the agencies in completing this work and any opportunities to overcome them.

Challenges GAO Faces in Auditing Programs that Serve Tribes and Their Members

- Breadth of agencies audited and programs covered
- Diverse topic areas require mission team-specific expertise
- Two primary Congressional committees, substantial ancillary interest
- Lack of standardization in approach to working with tribes and tribal governments
- High-Risk List messaging



Enhancing GAO's Capabilities for Auditing Tribal Programs and Working with Tribes

- Top-down commitment with dedicated resources
- Establishment of tribal advisory council
- Development of protocols for working with tribes and tribal governments
- Enhancing relationships with tribal stakeholders (governments, organizations, and tribal members)
- Coordinated Congressional outreach
- Incorporating tribal governments in GAO's strategic plan



Anticipated Outcomes of GAO's Internal Capacity Building Initiative

- Better understanding of issues faced by tribes and of challenges administering federal government programs that serve tribes and their members
- Potential to improve the administration of programs and illustrate effective self-governance initiatives
- Enhanced communication with tribes and their members
- Improved data on programs serving tribes including information on program outcomes
- More strategic approach to GAO work
