#### Genesis

- Media Reports: Doctors Under Contract with The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (Corrections) Had Performed Procedures Without Approvals
- Women's Caucus Concerned that Inmates Are Coerced to Undergo Procedure
- Audit Requested by Women's Caucus

#### Background

- Multiple Entities Involved in Providing Medical Care to Inmates
  - Corrections
  - Receiver's Office (California Correctional Health Care Services)
  - Three Facilities House Female Inmates
- Multi-level Process for Approving Medical Procedures for Inmates

#### Audit Scope/Objectives

- Assess Policies, Procedures, Protocols
- Review Each Tubal Ligation Performed Over Eight-Year Period
- Provide Demographics—In Particular Number of Prior Pregnancies and Child Births

# Audit Results—Key Findings

- 144 Tubal Ligations
- 39 Cases Performed Without Lawful Consent
  - 27 Cases: Physician Did Not Assert Patient Mentally Competent, Understood Effects, Waiting Period Met
  - 18 Cases: Violations In Waiting Period

#### Audit Results—Key Findings cont.

- Neither Agency Ensured Informed Consent Was Obtained From Inmate
- None of The Files Contained Progress Notes Showing That Prison Staff Counseled Inmates
- Prison Medical Staff Did Not Obtain
   Necessary Approvals For Medical Procedure

## Demographics

- 123 Cases: Between Age of 26 and 40
- 72 Cases: Literacy Less Than High School Proficiency
- 101 Cases: Inmate's First Incarceration
- 115 Cases: Has Three or More Children

#### Key Recommendations

- Refer the 39 Cases to The Medical Board and CA Dept. of Public Health
- Better Monitor Medical Staff & Contractors
- Improve Quality of Information Provided to Inmates and Document in Progress Notes
- Ensure Inmates Receive Only Properly Authorized Medical Services
