David has worked in the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office since 1986. He represented the state in Child support cases until 1989 when he transferred to the criminal area of the office. David was promoted to a Felony Team in 1990 where he prosecuted homicides, armed robberies, burglaries and other serious criminal matters.
