

## Turning data into action not yet routine

- Less than ½ of federal managers believe staff have the skills needed to collect, analyze and use different types of evidence
- When evidence was available, less than 2/3 use it in decision-making
- Only 1/3 of managers used evidence to inform the public



GAO survey of federal managers suggests progress needed on evidence-based policymaking

### Justice data quality issues

- 68% of state criminal history systems include disposition, in some states as few as 10% of records include it
- One state audit found 18% of records were misclassified, and up to 30% were misclassified at some law enforcement agencies
- In one state, 80% of ethnicity data is blank
