

#### U.S. 2024 Billion-Dollar Weather and Climate Disasters




### GAO 2025 HIGH RISK LIST



### OPEN DISASTERS

- FEMA is managing over 600 open major disaster declarations—some of which occurred almost 20 years ago, according to the agency.
- 102--disasters have been declared in 2025 (January through August)
- 164--disasters declared yearly on average (2020–2024)

# RECOVERY KEY PRACTICES

 Develop a practical framework for recovery, just as in response.

- Incorporate recovery into exercises. Develop challenging scenarios and close the gaps!
- Bring in the right people: Budget, legal, administrative staff will manage recovery. (Not just emergency managers)

### RECOVERY KEY PRACTICES

 Advance contracts are key to avoid waste: debris removal; commodities; housing.

 Contract and procurement flexibilities to meet recovery needs.

 Procedures and controls for disaster spending and recordkeeping. Once a disaster hits its too late to do this.
