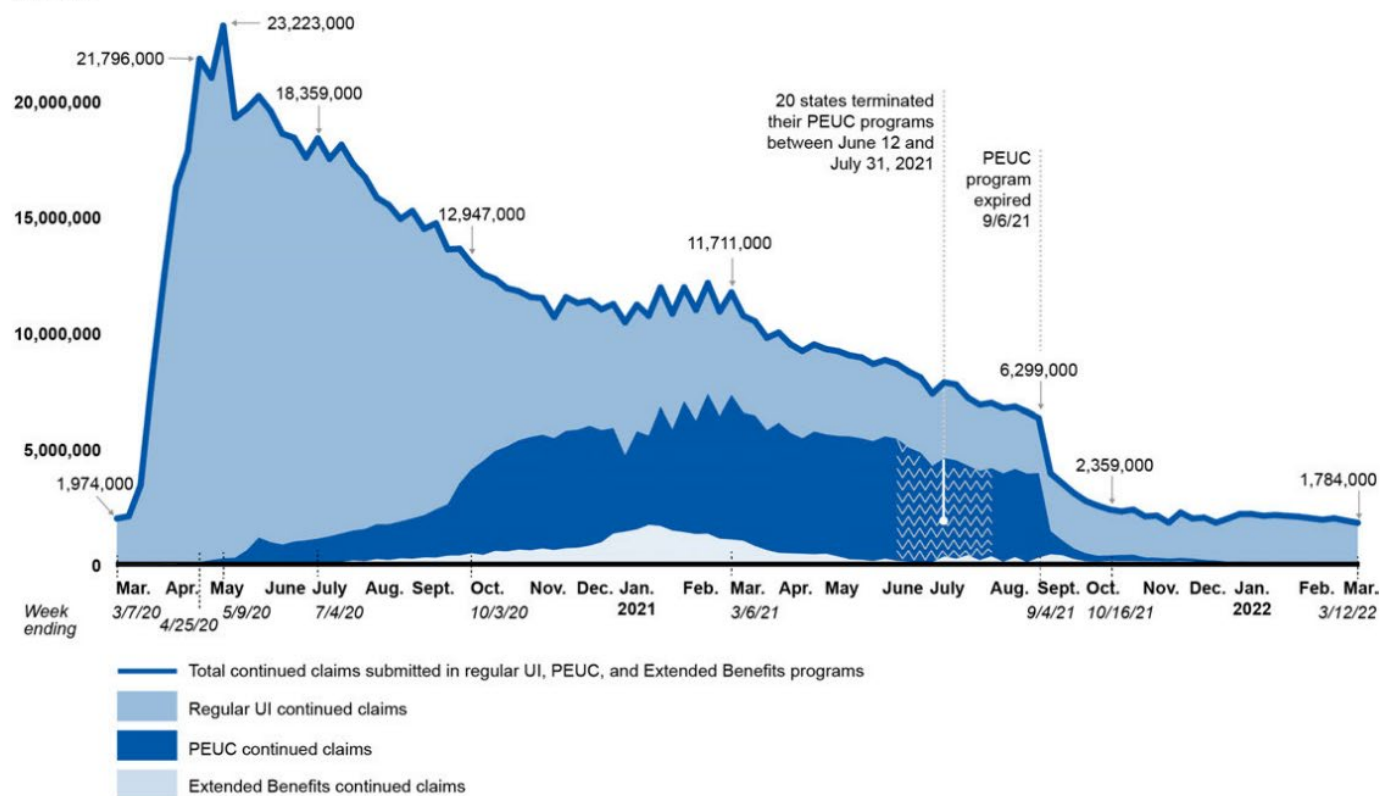

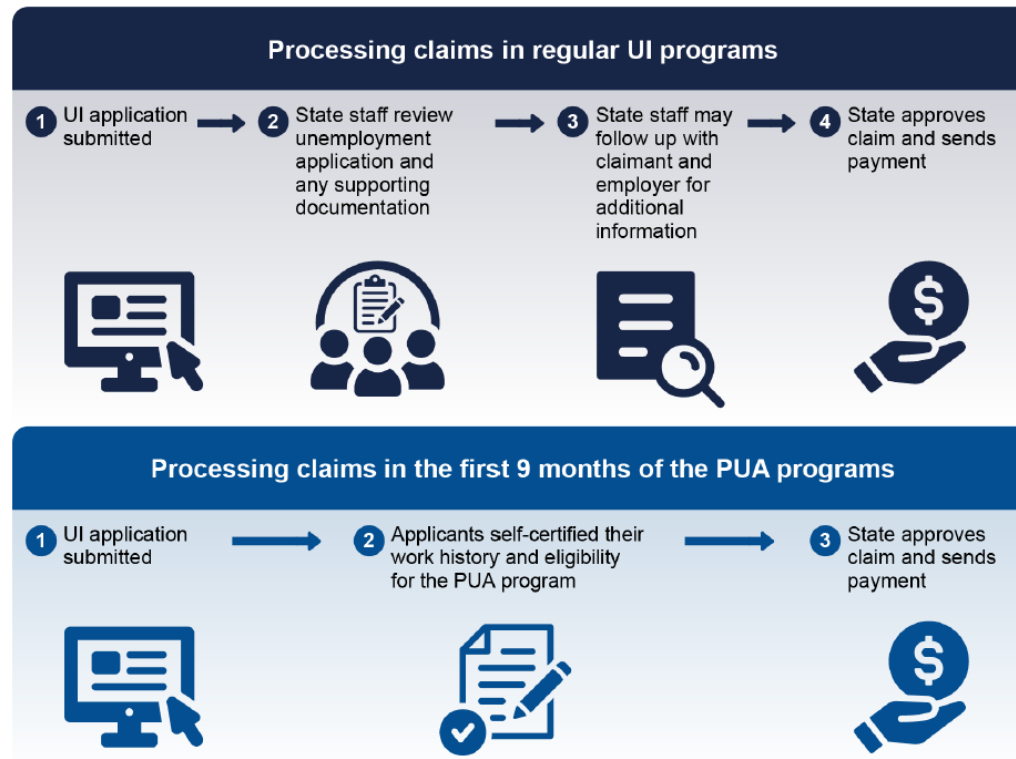

Key Challenges Facing the UI System

- **Improper payments**, including those due to fraud;
- **Program administration**, including inconsistent levels of support for workers across states, customer service issues, and declining administrative funding; and
- **Outdated IT systems** and challenges modernizing these systems.

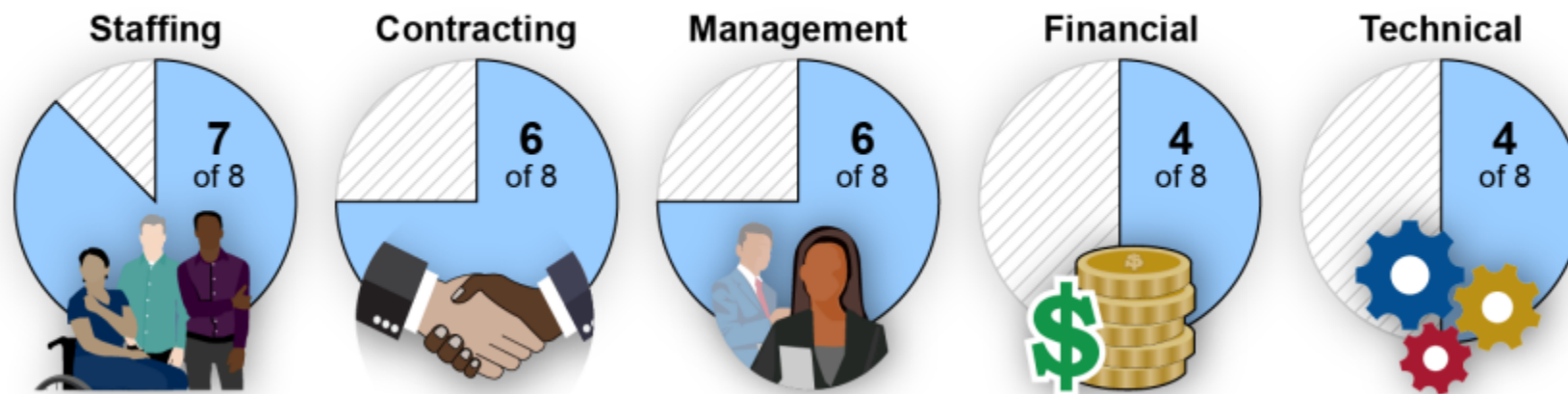

Why We Put UI System on Our High-Risk List

Figure 13: High-Risk Criteria Essential to Addressing High-Risk Areas

	LEADERSHIP COMMITMENT Demonstrated strong commitment and top leadership support.
	CAPACITY Agency has the capacity (i.e., people and resources) to resolve the risk(s).
	ACTION PLAN A corrective action plan exists that defines the root cause and solutions and provides an approach for substantially completing corrective measures, including steps necessary to implement solutions we recommended.
	MONITORING A program has been instituted to monitor and independently validate the effectiveness and sustainability of corrective measures.
	DEMONSTRATED PROGRESS Ability to demonstrate progress in implementing corrective measures and in resolving the high-risk area.

Progress Made on UI System Challenges

- Using American Rescue Plan Act funds, DOL provided states with about \$800 million in grants for needed UI system improvements;
- Since we added the UI system to our High-Risk list in 2022, DOL has implemented 13 of our recommendations; and
- Many states have repaid federal loans they took during the pandemic.

Next Steps for Minimizing IP and Fraud

DOL

- Track whether states have implemented expert recommendations
- Help states find long-term solution for identity verification
- Encourage states to fully use data cross-matching in UI Integrity Data Hub

States

- Continue to strengthen identity verification efforts
- Cross-match UI claimant data against multiple federal databases
- Continue to modernize UI IT systems to improve detection of improper payments and fraud

Next Steps for Addressing Other Challenges

DOL

- Further address capacity limitations for IT infrastructure
- Make additional progress on High-Risk criteria (capacity, monitoring, demonstrated progress)
- Address 14 open GAO recommendations

States

- Further address capacity limitations for IT infrastructure
- Implement expert recommendations and address priorities in UI transformation plan
- Bolster the solvency of state UI trust funds
